MACHC Integrated Chart Committee Wednesday, 23 October 2013 – Conference Call

1. Commencement of Call:

a. <u>Welcome & Introductions</u>: The Chair of the MICC, John Nyberg, opened the Conference Call with introductions and the identification of participants calling in. The following participants were on line:

b. <u>Approval of the Agenda:</u> No further changes were suggested and the Agenda was accepted as presented.

2. MICC Organization:

- a. The Chair noted that Olivier Parllivers (France) has moved to another position and is no longer a participant in the MICC. Similarly, Dagoberto David (Colombia) has also moved to another position and is also no longer a participant. The "Participant List" has been updated as appropriate and is attached as Annex B.
- b. <u>Approval of Minutes (from 22 May MICC Conference Call)</u>: The minutes were approved with no further comments.
- c. MICC Administrative Actions:

The only administrative action pertained to the drafting of the report, which will be presented to the MACHC Conference in December 2013 is **deferred**, as it is not due until the 14th MACHC.

3. INT Charts:

- a. Review of INT Chart Actions:
 - i. Action 12 (Venezuela and UK to review limits for INT 4102) is **on-going.** A meeting is planned for November to further discuss and resolve this issue.
 - ii. Action 13 (Colombia and UK to explore the need to reduce major overlap between charts 4025 and 4011) is **on-going.** The UK will contact Colombia

regarding this issue and follow up with an e-mail to Colombia. One concern is that the chart actually exceeds the UK paper size.

Action 4.1: UK to contact Colombia regarding the overlap and paper size of INT Charts 4025 and 4011.

- iii. Action 19 (Mexico to work with UK on the boundaries between the existing Mexican INT Charts and UK charts in neighboring RHCs. Include Colombia and Nicaragua as necessary) remains on-going. The UK was very pleased with the chart scheme proposed by Mexico, but needs to take a more detailed look into the scheme.
- iv. Action 3.1 (MICC Chair to contact Mexico and encourage direct communication with the UK to address the overlap issue) is **completed.**
- v. Action 3.2 (Leland Snyder to check on the Clipperton Island Chart and whether it is shown in Region B or Region C) is **completed.** It falls within the MACHC, and is not shown in the Catalog. It was suggested that this be added to the Agenda for the December meeting and added to the "Pacific" scheme.
- b. <u>Updates to Current INT Chart Coverage:</u> Leland Snyder introduced this topic with a request for any updates as appropriate. Further, Leland will send everyone an e-mail request for updates as a reminder.
 - The Netherlands commented that for INT Chart 4108, Venezuela is the producer and that the Netherlands is the printer.
- c. <u>Mexican Proposal</u>: Mexico provided clarification of their proposed INT Chart scheme, which was shared with the group. Ricardo López Cruz (México) explained that the charts are designed to get ships safely in and out of Mexican ports. Further as the paper product is developed, it will also influence the development of the corresponding ENC. At this time Tim Lewis (UK) indicated that Cuba plans to attend the MACHC and will be interested in this scheme, since it affects Cuban charts as well. Furthermore Cuba needs documentation such as Agendas and meeting schedules in order to gain approval to their travel requests.

Ian Spurway (UK) noted that the uniformity of the scheme was very appealing and that he would like to further examine it. Ricardo López Cruz (México) indicated that if anyone wishes to further discuss this plan to simply contact him so that an agreement can be in place by December. Since the UK expressed such an interest, the UK will contact México to follow up.

Action 4.2: UK to contact Mexico to finalize details of the chart scheme.

Leland Snyder requested the limits of the UK coverage so that it might be incorporated into a graphic.

<u>Action 4.3:</u> UK to provide limits of coverage to be incorporated into the Mexico scheme for display purposes.

Jan Schaap (Netherlands) noted a point of order regarding the Spanish language used in the México proposal. It was noted that the Netherlands could not properly evaluate the proposal because they did not understand it, and suggested that English be used in future documents. [Note: According to the Statutes of the MACHC, English is identified as the working language of MACHC.]

4. Electronic Charts:

a. Review of Electronic Chart Actions:

Action 6 (UK and Celebrity Cruises (cruise industry) to discuss alternate sources of survey data and how/if it can be applied to charting products in the Bahamas) is **ongoing**. (See comments in item "b" below.)

- b. <u>Cruise Lines Requests/Private Sources for ENCs:</u> Ian Spurway (UK) indicated that they have had several conversations with the Cruise Lines' contract surveyors and are now in early negotiations. It was further noted that there is optimism for a positive outcome, but a final agreements with several Cruise Lines remains to be reached.
- c. <u>Annex A:</u> Leland Snyder indicated that a great many overlap issues have been resolved to date, but that this is a continuing effort as new cells are made available by different Member States and will remain an active task.
 - Paulo Matos (Brazil) stated that they have had some issues and their cells, BR321300 and BR321400 and are now be delayed until 2014.
- d. Annex B: Ian Spurway (UK) stated that with regard to the gap in coverage of Roatan Island, the UK has been in discussion with Carnival Cruise Lines and their contractor has provided data. The charts are now planned for production in Feb 2014. The gaps in the Bahamas are still in negotiations. Leland Snyder noted that the last pending gap in coverage is the Oronco River in Venezuela. Willner Pino (Venezuela) indicated that they are making arrangements for someone to do this work. Leland requested an update of any information pertaining to these gaps by December.
- 5. Action 4.4: Venezuela to provide update on the progress of ENC development in the Orinoco River area.

Leland Snyder noted that he has a short list of ENCs indicating that they were expected to be available by now and requires updating for the Report. Leland will send an e-mail to request updates for those ENCs. This information is required by November 8 so that the Report can be put together for final review.

Action 4.5: Leland to send request for updates to the table of ENCs and their availability dates.

<u>Action 4.6:</u> All MICC participants to respond to Leland with updates to the table of ENCs and their availability by November 8.

Leland mentioned the "Priority Ports" list and whether it may be time for an update because some ENCs are coming on-line which cover areas not on the Priority Ports List.

As this was initially done by the UK, Ian Spurway stated that the UK would provide an update of the "Ports Analysis".

Action 4.7: UK to provide an update to the Ports Analysis.

The Netherlands asked to see the list of ENCs and noted that it may be useful to provide such a list on the website. Leland indicated that a companion graphic may be useful as well.

<u>Action 4.8:</u> US to look into providing a listing of "available" ENCs and possibly a companion graphic on the MICC website. [This is being addressed now and is expected to be available soon.]

The Chair mentioned the WEND activities and indicated that he would provide an update at the December Meeting.

Action 4.9: MICC Chair to provide an update on WEND activities at the December meeting.

7. MICC Report:

Erich Frey went through the draft report, explaining that there are 3 main sections; Section 1-INT Charts; Section 2-ENCs; and Section 3-Recommendations. Jan Schaap (Netherlands) stated that "INT Charts" and "ENCs" should be synchronized as best as possible and suggested that it be added as a recommendation in the Report. This was supported and will be an added recommendation in the report.

<u>Action 4.10:</u> US to include recommendation stating that "INT Charts" and "ENCs" should be synchronized as best as possible.

8. Any Other Business:

- a. It was noted that several dates had to be adjusted on the Workplan due to the closure of the US Government. This was discussed and a revised updated "Workplan" is attached as Annex C.
- 9. <u>Adjourn:</u> The Conference Call adjourned at 10:35 EDT. The next meeting is scheduled for December 9th at 1300 in St. Maarten.
